



In academic year 2016-2017 there were 81,193 Asian American students enrolled in independent school districts in the Greater Houston area. This was an increase of 23%, or 15,333 students, from 2011-2012 versus an increase of 9.5% for the entire independent school district population. These students represented 7.3% of all students in the Greater Houston area and 36.1% of all Asian American students enrolled state-wide in Texas independent school districts.

The ten Greater Houston area school districts with the largest number of enrolled Asian students were:

The top ten independent school districts were home to 87% of all Asian-students in the Greater Houston area. Three school districts on the west side of Houston enrolled 24% of all the Asian American students in the Greater Houston area: Fort Bend ISD, Katy ISD and Cy-Fair ISD.
