



In 2012 there were 155,784 Asian-owned businesses in the state of Texas. These businesses represented 6.6% of all businesses in Texas. From 2007 to 2012, the number of Asian-owned business grew 36% or 41,487.

The ten Texas cities with the largest number of Asian-owned business were:

The top ten cities were home to 93% of all Asian-owned businesses in Texas. 87% of all Asian-owned businesses were concentrated in the top four metropolitan areas. The Houston metro area had the highest percentage of Asian-owned businesses at 10.8%.
