Established in 1926, College of Marin has remained committed to educational excellence, providing equitable opportunities, and fostering success in all members of our diverse community. With campuses in Kentfield and Novato, students of all ages have affordable access to an exciting variety of credit and noncredit courses, as well as community education classes for lifelong learning. Whether students are interested in transferring to a university, training for a new career, improving skills, or enriching their lives, College of Marin is a place where all are welcome to pursue their dreams.

Eight major construction projects were completed under the 2004 Measure C facilities improvement bond. These projects have resulted in more energy efficient facilities. Under the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED®) Building Rating System, the Irwin P. Diamond Physical Education Center, Main Building, Fine Arts Building, Performing Arts Building, and Science/Math/Nursing Building achieved LEED® Gold; the Transportation Technology Complex was awarded LEED® Silver; the Child Study Center achieved LEED® certification. LEED® Gold is pending for the Academic Center.

The physical transformation of College of Marin's campuses will continue thanks to Marin County voters passing the Measure B facilities bond in June 2016. This allows the College to move forward with projects, upgrades, and repairs to maintain and enhance the high-quality education programs provided to students and the community.

The Kentfield Campus is located 10 miles north of the Golden Gate Bridge at 835 College Avenue in Kentfield. Located in Novato, the Indian Valley Campus is located on a spectacular 333 acre site approximately 10 miles north of the Kentfield at 1800 Ignacio Boulevard.
