### **New strategic alliance, new hospital building on the horizon — an exciting year of progress and potential for Marin General Hospital**

Marin General Hospital welcomes another year of progress and positive change for healthcare in Marin County.

One of the most exciting developments is our expanded collaboration with the UCSF Health Bay Area network which has led to a formal strategic alliance between UCSF Health and our Marin clinicians. With the highest level of expertise in pediatric diabetes, cardiology, high-risk pregnancy, neurosurgery and intensive care for newborns now available in this community, the alliance will dramatically increase the community's access to highly specialized medical care.

Also exciting are the great strides we have made in this our final year of construction on MGH 2.0, the first phase of our hospital replacement project. The project is on schedule, both inside and out, in large part due to a sophisticated pre-planning process in which even before the construction crew broke ground, the architect, engineers, contractor and subcontractors discussed the plans and addressed potential challenges. As a result, we have encountered remarkably few problems, and construction remains on schedule. Staff is already at work planning the complex training and transition process necessary to move staff, patients, equipment, and protocols over to the new building. We plan to welcome our first patients in June 2020.

The second year of our successful Community Health Seminar series is off to a good start with a seminar on mental health in Marin County, especially in the areas of substance abuse and teen mental health.
