With campuses in Kentfield and Novato, students of all ages have affordable access to an exciting variety of credit and noncredit courses, as well as community education classes for lifelong learning. Whether students are interested in transferring to a university, training for a new career, improving skills, or enriching their lives, College of Marin is a place where everyone is welcome to pursue their dreams.

Thanks to the support of Marin County voters in 2016, the Measure B facilities bond is funding a physical transformation of the College's campuses. Athletic fields at the Kentfield Campus received upgrades, including new synthetic turf fields, tennis courts, and bleachers. Future projects include a new Learning Resources Center and Maintenance and Operations District Warehouse, and enhancements that will provide our students and the community with access to modern, well-maintained educational facilities.

At the Indian Valley Campus, new classrooms, facilities, and the Nugget Markets Demonstration Kitchen opened in fall 2018. The expansion continues with work progressing on the highly anticipated Bill and Adele Jonas Center and Miwok Aquatic and Fitness Center. Once complete, the Jonas Center will seat 300 people and includes a catering kitchen, prep kitchen, stage, and meeting rooms. Construction of the multi-purpose aquatic and fitness center will provide Marin County with a vibrant hub supporting wellness, kinesiology, and athletics programs for students and the surrounding community.

The Kentfield Campus is located 10 miles north of the Golden Gate Bridge at 835 College Avenue in Kentfield. Located in Novato, the Indian Valley Campus is situated on a spectacular 333-acre site approximately 10 miles north of Kentfield at 1800 Ignacio Boulevard.
