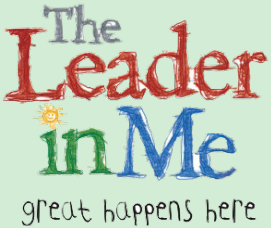
# CHRISTIAN COUNTY COMMUNITY VISION PLAN

The Community Vision Plan began in 2005 and is strategic plan for Christian County. It is intended to guide improvements, collaborate with community partners and act in a unified approach to achieve progress for the community. The plan works toward four goal areas in an effort to achieve overall economic growth and improve the lives of all citizens in Christian County.

## GOAL I Education: Improve educational system in our community

### Accomplishments:

- Introduced new TRACK Apprenticeship program to begin at Gateway Academy for fall of 2016 for high school juniors in Industrial Maintenance
- KY FAME offered through HCC and local manufacturers beginning the fall of 2016
- Freedom Elementary 1st school in district to be a Leader in Me School
- 18 Teacher and Staff Appreciation events held in district schools and private schools
- CCPS has (5) Proficient Schools with Sinking Fork Elementary being a Distinguished school and Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary and Crofton Elementary being recognized as High Progress Schools
- 14 students from Christian County (HHS, CCHS, UHA and HCA) were selected to attend Governor’s Scholars Program for 2016



## GOAL II Engage Leaders: Ensure all community members are active participants within the community

### Accomplishments

- Held monthly Community Consultants meetings
- HYPE(Hopkinsville Young Professionals Engage) created for young professionals age 21-45 within the community
- 75 graduates of Leadership Hopkinsville-Christian County; FOCUS 21st and Youth Leadership for 2015-2016
- 1st Mayor’s Youth Council formed involving high school students in the community



## GOAL III

### Enhancement of Infrastructure: Improve physical aspects of our community

#### Accomplishments:

- More than 20,000+ rides given on the Hopkinsville Transit System in its first year of operation
- Groundbreaking in March 2016 of the Hopkinsville Skate Park
- Groundbreaking in April 2016 of the Hopkinsville Dog Park
- Supporter of Banners on the Boulevard enhancement project
- Hopkinsville designated as a Play Ball City in March 2016



## GOAL IV

### Economic Growth: Improve the overall economy of our community thus creating business and jobs

#### Accomplishments:

- Four New Retail Development Centers in Hopkinsville announced, under construction or opened
- Hopkinsville Towne Center announced and when fully developed could create 250 jobs
- 200 jobs created in 2015 through job creation and expansion\*
