The Trade Adjustment Assistance (TAA) program is a federal program that provides reemployment services to workers who have lost their jobs as a result of foreign trade. The TAA program seeks to provide these trade-affected workers with opportunities to obtain the skills, resources, and support they need to become reemployed.

The Trade program offers a variety of benefits and services for workers. Potential benefits include:

- Career counseling
- Skills testing and training (if necessary)
- Job search allowances
- Relocation allowances
- Wage supplement for individuals 50 years and older
- Tax credits to provide health coverage
- Weekly allowances to assist you in returning to the workforce
