

DESTINATIONS AND ATTRACTIONS

Iowa's Largest Historic Courthouse Square District includes 119 properties on the National Register of Historic Places, Victorian and Italianate styles, a Civil War monument and a three-story courthouse with tile roof. This bustling district is lined with specialty shops, apparel retailers and restaurants.

The Shoppes at Bradley Hall, Centerville, is an exciting antique and specialty store. Located in one of Centerville's finest early 1900s mansions, Bradley Hall was once the home of a prominent Centerville family. Over the years, the home was used for various purposes and has recently been restored, inside and out, to its original magnificence. Bradley Hall has room after room of unique collectibles, antiques and one-of-a-kind items. A tour guide will be happy to share a full history of the home and its many owners with your group.

The Columns is one of Centerville's most unique gift and antique destinations. With four fireplaces and remarkable detail, this grand home is the perfect place to spend an enjoyable afternoon browsing the hundreds of specialty items. Guided tours of this remarkable home are available.

One of a Kind, Centerville, is an elegant 3 story Italianate house located one block west of the Square. It is the second oldest surviving house in Centerville.

The Rathbun Fish Hatchery at Rathbun Lake is Iowa's largest warm water fish hatchery. Features aquarium with native Iowa fish on display. Visitors can view the hatchery operations from an elevated walkway throughout the facility to see fish eggs in large cylinder incubators and the feeding of infant fish.

Rathbun Country Music Theater is located 1 ¼ miles north of the Rathbun Dam and has been in operation for more than 30 years. Show time begins at 8 p.m. every Saturday from April to October. Each weekend features a different regional performer as well as the house band. An excellent option if your group is interested in an overnight stay at one of our hotels or cabins.

Appanoose County Historical and Coal Mining Museum in Centerville is a former post office that now houses a pioneer farm and village replica, post office display and historical information about Appanoose County. A working replica of a coal mine includes mining tools, photos and videos of local mines.

Wabash Depot Museum in Moravia has been restored to its appearance and is loaded with railroad artifacts. A wonderful experience for the train lover. Guided tours available.

Trolley Tours are available to travel to historic and scenic locations throughout the county including Courthouse Square District, mansions on Drafé Avenue, the Levee and historic churches. Narrative excursion is sponsored by Historic Preservation Corporation. Cost is \$5
