## Loudonville-Perrysville Exempted Village School District Profile (2013-2014)

**Description:** The Loudonville-Perrysville Exempted Village School District is located in southern Ashland County approximately 20 miles southeast of Mansfield, Ohio at the intersection of SR 60 and SR 39. The district covers 119 square miles and includes portions of Ashland, Holmes, Knox, and Richland counties. District territory in Ashland County includes Green, Hanover and Lake Townships as well as the Villages of Loudonville and Perrysville. District residents are part of the 7<sup>th</sup> Federal Congressional District, 19<sup>th</sup> or 22<sup>nd</sup> Ohio Senate District, and 2<sup>nd</sup>, 68<sup>th</sup> or 70<sup>th</sup> Ohio House Districts. The district population is 8,220. Median Household Income is \$44,317 and Mean Household Income is \$51,208. District expenditure per pupil in 2012 was \$10,867.

**District:** The district is comprised of two elementary schools (PK-3 and 4-6) and one high school (7-12).

**District Awards and Recognition:** The following schools are recognized as "Schools of Promise" by Ohio's Superintendent of Public Instruction: McMullen Elementary (2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, and 2012), Budd Elementary (2007 and 2012) and Perrysville Junior High (2008). McMullen Elementary is a *Hall of Fame School*. The Junior High received a *Making Middle Grades Work School Improvement Award (Silver Level)* in 2012.

In 2012-2013 the district met 23 of 24 indicators on Ohio's Local Report Card for a grade of "A", achieved a Performance Index Score of 98.3 for a grade of "B", and earned a "B" for a Graduation Rate of 92.8%.

### Faculty and Staff

Loudonville-Perrysville Exempted Village School District employs 83 licensed/certified educators, 2.6 guidance counselors, 4.5 building administrators, 0.50 athletic director, and 55 support staff. 71.8% of the instructional staff holds at least a Master's Degree. 100% of core academic subjects at the elementary and secondary levels are taught by Highly Qualified Teachers.

### Students with Special Needs

The district maintains a comprehensive program for special needs students including a unit for students with autism (K-3). We believe all children can learn. 17.1% of our students receive at least one special education service.
