### Economic Restructuring

- ✓ 2015 Reinvestment Statistics were revised, due to additional info required, the total reinvestment figure for 2015 is \$1,273,698.70. This is a record for Downtown Perryville.

### Design

- ✓ The new gutters have been installed on Dr. Polk's house.
- ✓ During the flood on Christmas day high water washed out a portion of the dry laid stone foundation on the warehouse building. Simms Kerbaugh is quoting the repairs for this building. He is also giving us a quote for the foundation of the storage barn on the Kerrick Parks property which is used by the city to store equipment, the limestone retaining wall/curb at the Kerrick Parks house which was damaged by a truck and trailer and minor foundation repairs for Green's Drug Store, Parks Store and the Opera House. We also had him quote repair of the retaining wall/sidewalk in the park between Green's and Parks Store.

### Events

- ✓ Planning for the 2016 National Commemoration will start this month. We will be coordinating with the park and the state.
- ✓ Main Street Perryville board meeting is scheduled for January 21, at 6 pm. At that time we will set our event calendar for 2016.
- ✓ Attended the Perryville Community Meeting on Monday, January 4<sup>th</sup>. The meeting was well attended. The meeting was held to get community input on a propose Historic Ordinance and future plans for the historic building owned by the city on Merchants Row.

### Organization

- ✓ Attend 3 C's meeting on Monday mornings.
- ✓ Will attend EDP Board Meeting (next meeting scheduled for January 20th)
- ✓ Attend Main Street Conference in Frankfort January 13-15. Each region of Kentucky Main Streets will set up a display in the Capitol Rotunda for our state legislators. This is in observance of the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Preservation Act and to promote continued support for funding for preservation. We are in the Crossroads Region, which includes Bardstown, Campbellsville, Danville, Springfield and Perryville.

**Main Street Perryville** is an Accredited Kentucky Main Street Program (KYMS) community. KYMS is the oldest statewide Main Street network in the nation, administered by the Kentucky Heritage Council/State Historic Preservation Office under the direction of the National Main Street Center. The goal of **Main Street Perryville** is to facilitate downtown revitalization, public private partnerships and economic development within the context of historic preservation. Through KYMS, more that \$4.5 billion has been invested in Kentucky communities since 1979.
