Hours: Thurs – Sat. 11-4; Sun. 2-4; Mid-April to Mid-Dec  
Admission - Free  
Restored 1890 MKT Depot; a tourist’s information center housing historic memorabilia of the early 1900’s, World War II Naval Hero Paul Carr
- Heartland Museum & Gallery -116 N Broadway, 918-473-2070  
Hours: Thurs – Fri, 10-4 and also open by appointment  
Cowboy-Native American-Pioneer-Artifacts-Historical pictures  
Artwork from local artists and well known artists
- Honey Springs Civil War Battlefield Visitor Center & Museum - 6 miles NE of Checotah; pavilion and monuments marking the largest Civil War Battle in Indian Territory, July 17, 1863; trails with historical markers and visitor’s center
- Bessie Tabor Park - SW 4<sup>th</sup> and Lafayette Avenue
- Tracy Scroggins Park - 200 E. Okmulgee Avenue
- Checotah Sports Complex - North Broadway - walking trail, splash pad, disc golf, exercise equipment and more.
- 1903 Former I.O.O.F. Home - North Broadway; served both children and adults until 2002; original buildings; Romanesque architecture
- Historic Business District - 4 blocks at Gentry & Broadway; one of only 15 in Oklahoma
- United Methodist Church - 419 W. Gentry Ave, 918-473-5714; listed on the National Register of Historic Places, 1982
- Jim Lucas Library - 626 W. Gentry, 918-473-6715; building named to honor Checotah’s Pulitzer Prize Winner, 1954; displays artifacts from local world travelers
- Senior Citizens / Community Center - 611 N. Broadway, 918-473-6741; facility opened in 1991
- Lake Eufaula State Park - Hwy 150; 918-689-5311; riding stables, cabins, fishing, boating and camping, golf course, airfield and marina
- Creek Nation Casino - 830 N Broadway; 918-473-5200; 300 + casino games; hours open from 8a.m. to 6a.m.
- Indian Territory Cemetery - S.W. 4th & W. Lafayette Ave.
