

Carpinteria State Beach



- All State Parks in the Channel Coast District are now operating in the soft closure model.
 - This soft closure means that there is no vehicular access to parks; facilities including campgrounds, parking lots, picnic areas, restrooms, visitor centers, historic buildings and offices are all closed to the public.
 - Outdoor day use areas including trails and beaches remain open; active recreation is encouraged, including but not limited to biking, hiking, running, walking; and water activities including, but not limited to swimming, fishing and surfing.
 - Gatherings are Prohibited.
 - Crowds or groups of visitors congregating will be dispersed.
 - Physical distancing of 6 feet or greater must always be maintained.
- State Parks is committed to providing opportunities in compliance with the Governor's Executive Order for the public to get outside, have healthy experiences and minimize stress where possible.
 - The intent of this order is not for the public to travel for the purposes of recreation.
- State Parks will continue to monitor visitation and physical distancing at all State Parks.
 - Groups, and those passively recreating should expect to be contacted regarding the regulations.
 - Violation of those regulations may result in a citation and/or eviction from the park.
 - If the safety measures implemented thus far are not sufficient to protect public health, additional measures may be taken to fully close more State Parks.
