1. All contestants must turn in an entry form **before** 4:00 pm on Friday, July 14th, 2017.
2. Girls must be entering 2nd, 3rd, or 4th grades in the 2017/2018 school year.
3. Girls must RESIDE in the ADM school district.
4. On the evening of the event, contestants are encouraged to wear a nice dress outfit. However, we do not want this to be a hardship or a reason for not participating. An appropriate guide would be if the outfit could be worn to church or a school concert.
5. All contestants are requested to be dressed and present at the Raccoon Valley Bank Community House (1016 Main St) by 5:30 PM on Friday, August 11th, 2017.
6. Princess and her court will be selected by **RANDOM DRAWING**.

Additional information:

A meeting & practice session will be held on Wednesday, August 9th, 2017 at 6:30 PM.

The 2017 Adel Sweet Corn Princess will receive a crown, sash and scepter.

1st, 2nd, and 3rd runners-up will receive a crown and sash.

All contestants will receive a t-shirt, a ribbon of participation and other items.

All Princess contestants will report to the Raccoon Valley Bank Community House at 1016 Main Street between 5:15-5:30 on Friday night. The event starts at 6:00.

Princess contestants will sit on the stage during the event on Friday evening. During the event, each contestant will be introduced to the audience. After the introductions, contestants will be called individually to the front of the stage for a brief interview by the Master of Ceremonies. The questions may include basic information about each contestant, their hobbies, favorite food, and/or their family. These questions are carefully selected and reviewed to ensure safety and entertainment.

Volunteers will be stationed stage side to help the girls on and off the stage. It is preferred that contestants walk unassisted across the stage. However, if a contestant gets confused or has difficulty, she will be assisted. We encourage parents and guardians to stay in the audience seating area. We want this to be fun for everyone and will be accommodating for all contestants.

If your child has special needs or disabilities that we should be aware of, please contact one of us prior to the event so that we may make appropriate accommodations. If the lack of dress attire would prevent your child from participating, feel free to send a confidential message to the organizers and we will do our best to help you find a way for your daughter to participate.

Photos of the event may be taken to promote future events. Photos may be posted on the Sweet Corn Festival website, social media, the newspaper, or other appropriate public sources.

All contestants are encouraged to ride on the Corn Princess float during the Sweet Corn Festival Parade on Saturday morning. The parade begins at 18th and Main at 9:30 AM. More information about drop-off, pick-up, and the parade will be handed out at the meeting/practice on Wednesday, August 9th.
