Nominate a Citizen of the Year

Each year, approximately 2-3 months prior to the Annual Awards Dinner, all Chamber members will be contacted with information regarding nominations. The nomination form will be made available via the Chamber Link, and members can submit any name they feel should be considered for the current award. Completed forms shall include the reasons the person believes the nominee should be selected. These nomination forms will be collected

by the COTY Chairperson, who shall call a meeting of the five most recent recipients approximately 2-3 weeks prior to the Annual Awards Dinner. This committee of the five previous recipients shall meet, with the Chairperson serving as a non-voting member, to discuss the names that have been submitted and any other individuals that the committee believes should be considered. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to select the current year's recipient. Guidelines for this nomination shall include the following:

1. Nominees should embody an overall love of the Waushara County community over many years, including the most recent.
2. Nominees should live in Waushara County and his/her activities should be centered here.
3. Recognition will be given for leadership and performance for work done above and beyond his/her paid profession.
3. The individual recognized does not need to be a member of the Waushara County Chamber of Commerce.
4. There are no requirements or restrictions relating to gender, race, religion or ethnic background.
5. The nominee should have participated in a broad scope of activities over the course of more than one year. This should not be an award for a single activity, no matter how well it was executed.
6. The award will not be given posthumously.

Criteria:

- At least three full years of operation, beginning January 1, 2016.
- Must be a not-for-profit organization with a clearly defined mission.
- Organization must demonstrate community involvement and goodwill.
- Organization must be a 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(6) but does NOT need to be a WACC Member.

Consider the following questions in your entry summary:

1. What is the mission and vision of the organization? Where is the service area and what populations are served?
2. What accomplishment/ innovation/ milestone did the organization achieve IN THE LAST 18-24 MONTHS to support this nomination? What steps did the organization take that led to success?
3. Why is the organization deserving of this honor? What community impact or outcomes have occurred as a result of the work of the organization? How does the work of the nonprofit affect the community?

4. Describe how your nonprofit improves the life skills and quality of life of those being served by your nonprofit? Can include examples of what this organization does, examples: feeding the hungry, community clean up, caring for animals, etc.

The start of the school year is just around the corner and the annual Packer Backer campaign has returned to Waushara County. The campaign helps raise funds to pack backpacks with food. The Vision 2020 Backpack Nutrition Program offers a safety net for economically disadvantaged elementary students in Waushara County. The program provides nutritious meals for students to eat during weekends and school breaks when they don't have access to the school breakfast and lunch programs. Students qualify for the program if they are eligible for the Federal free/reduced lunch program. Non-perishable food items and coupons for fresh food travel home in student's backpacks each week. The program began in 2012, serving twenty six students in one elementary school. Today, the program serves four elementary schools with free and reduced lunch rates ranging from 55-72% of students. - ❖ September 18th-22nd, Ice Age Trail-Mobile Skills Crew Project on Bohn Lake. Waushara County is home to 20 miles of beautiful off-road hiking on the Ice Age National Scenic Trail. One beloved segment of the Trail travels through and around Bohn Lake State National Area. Bohn Lake is one piece of a 14-mile long glacial tunnel channel, created by a meltwater river flowing beneath glacial ice whose outlet was where the Village of Hancock stands today. The Ice Age Trail weaves in and out of this tunnel channel, opening for interpretation the subglacial flow of water which carved the landscape. September 18th-22nd volunteers will have the opportunity to participate in a trail building event on the Bohn Lake segment of the Ice Age Trail. During the event, which is part of the IATA's Mobile Skills Crew program, volunteers will help build an elevated boardwalk, stone steps and retaining walls, and close to a mile of sustainable footpath. Help is also needed cooking meals, removing invasive plants, updating and installing trail signage, and addressing existing trail maintenance needs. No previous experience is necessary, and there will be roles for all ages and abilities. Volunteers will gather Wednesday through Sunday mornings at 8 a.m. at Hancock Park, which serves as project basecamp. Trail work ends around 4 p.m. each day and at noon on Sunday. The IATA provides meals, tools, and a place to camp for free to all who volunteer. There is no obligation to stay for the entire event, but many do because of the fun atmosphere and camaraderie that develop throughout the project. - ❖ Wednesday, September 18th, "A World Ruled by Scarcity": Vision 2020 Brown Bags and Books Discussion. Last month's Brown Bags and Books group discussed Nickel and Dimed by Barbara Ehrenreich. She knows what it's like to be a maid. In her book Nickel and Dimed, Ehrenreich "inhabited" several low paying, hard-working jobs including working as a maid in an effort to understand the challenges of surviving on low wage work. Unlike Stephanie Land, author of the book Maid: Hard Work, Low Pay and a Mother's Will to Survive, Ehrenreich knew that she could go back to her "far-more-comfortable life as a writer." Stephanie cannot. Instead, she struggles to provide a safe home for her daughter while surviving on "bits of public assistance" and the low wages

of a maid. Her book describes the years she worked in low-paying domestic work. Ehrenreich who wrote the forward to Land's book, points out that "Stephanie's world is ruled by scarcity." Join a discussion of *Maid: Hard Work, Low Pay and a Mother's Will to Survive* on Wednesday, September 18th at Wautoma Public Library from 12:30-1:30pm or at Coloma Public Library, Thursday September 19th from 6-7 p.m. Copies of the book are available for check out at the Wautoma Library, 410 West Main Street in Wautoma and the Coloma Public Library, 155 North Front St. in Coloma. Even if you have not read the book, please join us for coffee and conversation about the challenges that face struggling individuals and families. "Brown Bags and Books" is a project of Waushara County's Vision 2020 initiative, offering citizens an opportunity to learn about poverty and help create solutions.

- ❖ Saturday, September 21st, Wild Rose Kiwanis Car Show Breakfast and Day Lily Sale. Wild Rose Kiwanis will offer a delicious breakfast of scrambled eggs, pancakes and sausage from 7:30 - 10:30 on Saturday, September 21, for Wild Rose Classic Car Show exhibitors and visitors. It will be held in the Wild Rose Lions Building, just south of the village. In addition, Kiwanis will be selling special day lily plants from 7:30 - 2, also at the Lions Building. One of the Wild Rose Kiwanis members is Darrel Apps, a nationally known day lily hybridizer. Dr. Apps has given a variety of named day lily varieties and selected seedlings to the Kiwanis to be sold as a fundraising project. Unlike the radio contest, teams are not able to use electronic devices to search for answers. The rules prohibit cellphones, computers, and communications devices. Points are determined based on how many people answer correctly – the fewer the number of correct answers, the higher the points, and vice versa. The team with the highest point total at the end of the night takes home a trophy. There will also be an award for best team costume. All proceeds from the event went to CAP Services Domestic Abuse Outreach Office in Waushara County. Funds help support CAP’s domestic abuse intervention services including domestic violence intervention, support groups, and community response.
