Re: Needed Business Liability Reform to Re-Open Safely

LUBBOCK, Texas – The Lubbock Chamber of Commerce will hold a webinar with the U.S. Chamber of Commerce to discuss business liability legislation, on Mon., June 1 at 2 p.m.

The webinar will be led by Matthew Webb, Senior VP of Legal Reform Policy with the U.S. Chamber’s Institute for Legal Reform. The Chamber is seeking reforms that would create a safe harbor for businesses that are following appropriate health guidelines to keep their employees and customers safe and discourage frivolous lawsuits. Businesses have cited their fear of litigation as a major hurdle to successfully re-opening and keeping the American workforce on payroll during the transition to re-opening parts of the economy.
