Serving Dutchess County



Eligibility:

To receive supportive services under this program, you must:

1) Be a Veteran, or the member of a family in which the head of household, or the spouse of the head of household is a Veteran.

2) Meet income eligibility requirements:

Your household annual income cannot exceed 50% of the Dutchess County area median income (AMI) as listed below.

Household Size	Maximum 50% Annual Income Limit
1	\$29,100
2	\$32,250
3	\$37,400
4	\$41,550

3) Be homeless or at imminent risk of becoming homeless.

What is the definition of a Veteran under the SSVF program?

A person who served in the United States military who was discharged or released under conditions other than dishonorable.
