[FSCC Bourbon County Tuition Waiver](#)

Fort Scott Community College has expanded its tuition waiver for Bourbon County residents who wish to take classes at the Fort Scott campus or online. FSCC will waive the tuition costs, up to fifteen credit hours, for any Bourbon County resident who enrolls at FSCC. Students will be responsible for covering fees and purchasing books.

FSCC students can take general education classes for transfer to a four-year institution or pursue a certificate or associate degree. FSCC offers 55 courses that are guaranteed by the Kansas Board of Regents to transfer to any public college or university in the state of Kansas.

To apply for the waiver, students should contact the FSCC Admissions Department at 620-223-2700, ext. 3520 or ext. 3530. Students must also complete a Bourbon County Tuition Waiver Form and return it to the Admissions Department prior to the start of the semester. For more visit fortscott.edu/scholarships

[Nursing](#)

The Fort Scott Community College Nursing Department offers an associate of applied science degree in nursing for students who have completed prerequisite courses and four semesters of nursing courses. Graduates are eligible to take the national licensing exam for registered nurses (NCLEX-RN) and to apply for state licensure as a registered nurse.

The program prepares students for beginning staff nursing positions and delivering nursing care to individuals and groups as members of a healthcare team to promote health and wellness. FSCC's Nursing Department participates in the Kansas Articulation Plan, which allows LPNs who hold a Kansas license to continue their studies at FSCC to obtain an associate's degree in nursing. FSCC nursing graduates can continue their studies at any of the state's 12 colleges and universities to obtain a bachelor's degree in nursing.

The FSCC nursing program is approved by the Kansas State Board of Nursing and is accredited by the Accrediting Commission for Education in Nursing, Inc. (ACEN). The nursing curriculum reflects the Kansas ADN Alignment project and is current with nursing theory and practice using Quality and Safety for Nursing Education (QSEN) as its framework.

[Emergency Medical Technician](#)

The Fort Scott Community College Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Program prepares students to provide care for patients in emergency medical settings. The program combines classroom learning with hands-on training in a variety of settings. Upon successful completion of the program, students earn a certificate and are eligible to take the Kansas and National Registry certification exams. The EMT program offers multiple enrollment periods each year—please check the course schedule for the next available classes at fortscott.edu/schedule.

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Welding

The Fort Scott Community College Welding Program provides students with comprehensive, hands-on training in welding technology. Through the one-year certificate program, students can earn industry-recognized credentials, such as the American Welding Society Structural Certification D1.1. These credentials are entered into a national registry that is portable and available to contractors.

John Deere

The Fort Scott Community College John Deere Technician Training Program provides students with quality, hands-on training and real-world experience. Through the program, students learn how to troubleshoot, service, repair, and rebuild John Deere equipment. Upon completion of the program, students will earn an associate of applied science degree. The program can be completed in five semesters, or approximately 21 months. Two half-semester (eight weeks each) are spent in an internship at a sponsoring John Deere dealership to apply the subjects learned in the classroom to real-world situations. Because considerable time is spent working at the dealership, this program requires students to have a sponsoring John Deere dealership.

Heating, Ventilation & Air Conditioning

The Fort Scott Community College Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) Program provides students with a variety of hands-on, real-world experiences. Coursework incorporates electrical and mechanical systems involved with HVAC and refrigeration. Students are trained to evaluate and determine proper operation of these systems, as well as basic maintenance and repairs for commercial, industrial and residential units. Students are also prepared to take the EPA refrigerant handling certification and other industry-recognized credentials. Students complete the program ready to work as entry-level service and warranty technicians in HVAC systems.

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
