How to Enroll

It's easy to enroll in classes at FSCC, whether you're taking your first step as a first-year college student or high school student, or taking your next step in your career.

1. Apply to FSCC and send transcripts

[Apply online](#), and send your transcripts to FSCC:

- High school transcripts – fax to FSCC Registrar at 620-223-4927
- College transcripts – mail official copy to FSCC Registrar at 2108 South Horton, Fort Scott, Kansas 66701
- GED – mail scores to FSCC Registrar 2108 South Horton, Fort Scott, Kansas 66701

2. Complete a financial aid application

Complete the FAFSA at fafsa.gov (FSCC's school code is 001916).

3. Apply for scholarships

4. Complete a placement test

Complete the ACCUPLACER test or submit a score of 21 or higher on the English and math portions of the ACT. [Learn more about FSCC placement tests](#).

5. Contact FSCC Advisement Department

Financial Aid

- Create an FSA ID at fsaid.ed.gov, for yourself and your parent. Your FSA ID will be used throughout your college career; therefore, it is imperative that you keep this information in a safe and accessible place
- Submit the FAFSA at fafsa.gov

Submit the FAFSA *AFTER* you and your parents have filed taxes

Deadline dates to submit a FAFSA are: July 1 for fall semester and December 1 for spring semester

Items you will need:

- Previous year's tax returns for yourself and your parent(s)
(**NEW:** Tax returns will not be needed if the Data Retrieval Tool is used. [Click here for more details](#))
- FSA ID for yourself and your parent(s)
- FSCC's school code - 001916
- Submit all *official* transcripts to the Registrar's Office
- HS Transcript/GED
- Previous colleges/vocational schools
- Check the status of your financial aid by logging into your [GIZMO account and FSCC email](#)
- Submit any other required documents needed by the Financial Aid Office

Types of Financial Aid

Pell Grant

Federal grants are available to students who demonstrate financial need according to federal formulas. Grants do not have to be repaid. To apply for a Pell Grant, you will need to submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.gov.

Direct Subsidized & Unsubsidized Stafford Loan

Subsidized Direct Loans will be offered only to students with need based on a valid Student Aid Report. Unsubsidized Direct Loans will be available to students and not based on their need as calculated by their Estimated Family Contribution (EFC). The amount of eligibility will not exceed the maximum amount of the yearly allocation allowed by the Department of Education (DOE) and not exceed the student's cost of attendance. The Financial Aid office will package the maximum amount for which the student is eligible.

Scholarships

Fort Scott Community College offers students more than 350 scholarship opportunities.

2. Go to fortscott.edu/Student
3. Click [GIZMO](#) and sign in with your FSCC ID and PIN
4. Go to **Account Info** and select **Scholarship Application**

All waivers and scholarships require students to complete the FAFSA and FSCC Scholarship Application annually. Once the awarding process begins, you will receive an email with your scholarship offer, along with terms and conditions, that must be accepted and signed. This single application will automatically match you to more than 350 institutional and endowment scholarships offered at FSCC.

Note:

- Institutional and activity scholarships do not cover fees.
- All qualified admissions students through Pittsburg State University are not eligible for scholarships or waivers.
- Nursing students that are eligible for **book** scholarships will receive \$500.00 per semester

- Cosmetology students eligible for **book** scholarships will receive \$500.00 for the program (\$250.00 per semester).

Scholarships

Academic Excellence Scholarship

Includes: Tuition and books up to 18 hours for full-time students (12+ credit hours)

Open to: Students with a GPA of 3.5 or higher

Requirements: Maintain a GPA of 3.5 or higher while enrolled at FSCC.

Greyhound Advantage Award

Includes: Tuition and books up to 12 hours for full-time students (12+ credit hours)

Open to: Students with a GPA of 3.0 to 3.49

Requirements: Maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher while enrolled at FSCC

Activity Scholarships

Includes: Tuition and books up to 15 credit hours for full-time students (12+ credit hours)

Open to: Students interested in participating in the following student organizations: Athletic Training, Athletic Manager, Band, Choir, Greyhound #SocialSquad, Livestock Judging, Meats Judging, President's Ambassadors, Sports Broadcasting, STEM Club, and Theatre.

Requirements: Must meet semester criteria/expectations of the student organization.

Endowment Scholarships

Includes: Dependent upon type of scholarship

Open to: All students with 2.0 or higher GPA unless specified who meet donor criteria

Requirements: Must meet donor criteria. Most scholarships have minimum GPA requirements, often established by the donor. Some scholarships, however, have minimum GPA requirements established by the board of directors of the [FSCC Endowment Association](#).

Maroon and Gray Scholarship

The FSCC Maroon and Gray scholarship is an academic needs-based scholarship. Students must complete a FAFSA application, live in the dorms, be a Kansas resident, and have an unmet need (determined by Financial Aid office) **or** GPA of 2.5 or higher. This scholarship will cover up to 18 credit hours of tuition and books per semester. The Maroon and Gray scholarship does not cover room and board or fees. Applications for the Maroon and Gray Scholarship are available through the Admissions Office.

Tuition Waivers

Bourbon County Tuition Waiver

FSCC offers a tuition waiver exclusively for Bourbon County residents who wish to take classes on the Fort Scott campus or online. This waiver cannot be combined with academic/activity scholarships or other waivers. This waiver does not include fees and/or books.

Includes: Tuition waiver up to 15 credit hours per semester

Open to: Residents of Bourbon County, KS (excluding dorm, qualified admissions, concurrent, SB 155).

To apply: Students should contact the FSCC Admissions Department at 620-223-2700, ext. 3520 or ext. 3530. Students must also complete a [Bourbon County Tuition Waiver Form](#) and return it to the Admissions Department prior to the start of the semester.

Bourbon County High School Waiver

FSCC offers a tuition waiver for any Bourbon County high school student taking a concurrent class for one KBOR-approved class.

To apply: Students should contact the FSCC Admissions Department at 620-223-2700, ext. 3520 or ext. 3530. Students must also complete a [Bourbon County High School Tuition Waiver Form](#) and return it to the Admissions Department prior to the start of the semester.

FSCC Jumpstart Waiver

Includes: Tuition scholarship up to 15 credit hours per semester for the student's first year at FSCC.

Open to: Students who completed 12+ FSCC concurrent credit hours while attending high school. Excludes qualified admissions.

FSCC Tuition Waiver

Includes: Tuition scholarship up to 6 credit hours for full-time students (12+credit hours) or
Tuition scholarship to up 3 credit hours for part-time students (6-11 credit hours)

Open to: Full-time and part-time students with a GPA of 2.0 or above
