Frederick Road Extension Paving Begins July 19

July 19

The City of Opelika contractor will be preparing the final paving of the Frederick Road extension from South Long Street to the new roundabout at Auburn Street and M L King Boulevard. Milling on Frederick Road to tie in the new surface will begin later this week and the paving is expected to begin Thursday, July 19. This paving will also be performed on M L King Boulevard to the railroad tracks and Auburn Street to Avenue B. The roadways will be open to traffic, but it will be limited to one lane and controlled by flaggers and/or pilot cars. Drivers are encouraged to use caution and patience as the paving is in progress. Municipal Court & Police Records to Change Locations During Construction of New Police Department

The City of Opelika will begin construction of its new police department the first week in August. August 8 will be the last regular Municipal Court held in current location until new construction is complete. Municipal Court will move to the Southside Center for the Arts (formerly the Brown School), 1103 Glenn Street, Opelika. Police Records and Police Walk-In Complaints will move to the City Annex Building at 608 Avenue A, Opelika. During construction, there will be NO PUBLIC ENTRANCE to the police department. There will be one rear entrance for police operations only.
