Enjoy these Historical Sites and Exhibits along the way...

- **Lincoln Statue** - Located on Mr. Lincoln's Square, Downtown Clinton. Dedicated in 1931, this bronze sculpture by A.L. VanDenBergen was erected by the people of Clinton to commemorate Lincoln's "Fool the People" speech.

- **Moore & Warner Farm Management** - 121 S. Center Street. Guests are welcome to step inside the restored building where Lincoln and C.H. Moore practiced law together.

- **DeWitt County Building** - 201 W. Washington Street. Browse through original Lincoln-related documents and exhibits featuring Lincoln's days in DeWitt County Court as an Eighth Judicial Circuit lawyer.

- **Vespasian Warner Library** - 310 N. Quincy Street. Enjoy the permanent but rotating "Lincoln in DeWitt County" exhibit and explore the DeWitt County Genealogical Society's collection to find out if your DeWitt County ancestors had ties with Lincoln. Additional Lincoln artifacts are also housed and displayed at the library.

- **Clinton Presbyterian Church** - 402 N. Center Street. Step onto the limestone step where Lincoln stepped in the 1850's.

- **DeWitt County Museum** - 219 E. Woodlawn Street. Tour the restored Victorian mansion that was once home to Lincoln's friend, law partner and political supporter, Clifton H. Moore. Gift Shop available.

- **Woodlawn Cemetery** - 200 Block of W. Woodlawn Street. The first burial, that of a Union soldier, took place in 1861 in the Civil War Soldiers' Plot. The plot is the resting place for over eighty Civil War soldiers and features interpretive signage and Civil War era cannons. Many more Union soldiers are buried throughout the cemetery. Several others laid to rest in this cemetery were Lincoln's contemporaries.

- **C.H. Moore House** - 10496 Trust Road. In this private residence, Clifton H. Moore often entertained his good friend, Abraham Lincoln.

- **Weldon Springs State Park** - 4734 Weldon Springs Road. Experience the Illinois landscape as Lincoln knew it. This park, donated by Lincoln Weldon in honor of his parents who were friends of Lincoln, includes over 80 acres of restored native prairie, providing a unique visual image of the early to mid-1800's Illinois landscape.
