Requirements:

- Full attendance and active participation in the two-day, overnight stay Kick-Off Retreat Sept. 26 & 27. Retreat begins 8:00 a.m. Sept. 26 at Camp Fish Tales.
- Full attendance and active participation in **at least eight of the nine day-long sessions**. Sessions occur one day per month from September through June between 7:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.
- Participants are strongly encouraged, but not required, to attend the Pre-Program Orientation and Graduation.
- Active participation and an active role in the community service project.
- Graduates are expected to take on leadership responsibilities in the community.

Tuition:

The **\$1,195 tuition fee** includes:

- All materials
- Meals and beverages
- All costs associated with the Kick-Off Retreat, monthly sessions and Graduation

Tuition may be paid all or in part by the participant or the participant's employer and must be paid in full prior to Graduation.

Curriculum:

The intensive program examines our community's agriculture, history, education, economy, government, human needs and services, law enforcement, natural resources, arts and culture, transportation and provides leadership skills training.
