LEARN ABOUT VOTER ELIGIBILITY + WHAT TO BRING TO THE POLLS

Please be aware that in order to vote, you will need to bring proof of your stakeholder status to this election. This means that on Election Day, you should bring documentation showing:

1. Who you are
2. That you're of voting age for this election (which is 18 to vote for all seats except for Student Representative voters, who must be ages 15-25)
3. That you are eligible to vote for each seat that represents you as a stakeholder

This Neighborhood Council has regional seats as well as seats representing different special interest groups (such as small businesses and students.)

If you're a local resident, a current driver's license or other photo ID with your birthdate and a local address on it will be all you need to qualify to vote for both your particular Geographic District seat as well as the Community Interest Representative.

If you are not a local resident, or don't have an ID with these features, many other types of documents are accepted as proof of stakeholder status. See a list of examples here:

Special Interest Seats:

Please bring proof of involvement for each category to qualify to vote in that category (see examples at <http://bit.ly/NCdocumentation>):

- Faith-based Representative: stakeholders age 18+ involved with any faith-based organization that lies within the neighborhood, such as a synagogue, church, temple, or mosque
- Neighborhood Organization Representative: stakeholders age 18+ involved with any community group that meets at least 4X/year within the neighborhood, such as a Neighborhood Watch, political, or seniors group
- Residents Association Representative: Stakeholders age 18+ living within the neighborhood who are members of a valid HOA or similar group that lies within the neighborhood and meets at least 4X/year
- Small Business & Workers Representative: stakeholders age 18+ involved in a neighborhood business employing 75 or fewer people (including home-based businesses.)
- Student Representative: Stakeholders age 15-25 who are also students

Please note that at Neighborhood Council elections, voters always fill out a short registration form at the polls before casting their ballots. You are not pre-registered to vote even if you are already registered to vote in national elections - or even if you've voted in a Neighborhood Council election previously.

ABOUT NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Your Neighborhood Council is your community's voice at City Hall. Together, LA's 99 Neighborhood Councils form the grassroots level of the Los Angeles city government. Unlike other municipal, state, or federal elections, Neighborhood Council elections are open to anyone who is part of the fabric of daily life in a community. A Council's stakeholders include those who live, work, or own property or a business there. Also included are "community interest stakeholders," who have another type of ongoing, substantial involvement within a Council's boundaries, such as students (or parents of students) at a school, or members of a church.

Voters and board members need not be US citizens or legal residents to qualify. Participation is also open to the formerly incarcerated.
