Your opportunity to weigh in on state's tax system

The 2019 Legislature has an excellent opportunity to enhance Minnesota's business tax climate and remove headwinds to economic growth for employers and employees alike. The first step is to adopt federal tax conformity.

Major federal tax reform in 2017 broadened the tax base but offset that by reducing tax rates and increasing standard deductions at the federal level. Now it's up to Minnesota. The adoption of new federal tax definitions will broaden the state tax base – increasing state income taxes for many Minnesota taxpayers – unless other state tax reforms are enacted.

Governor Walz unfortunately proposes to adopt the new federal definitions without offsetting rate reductions or other pro-growth tax reforms. He instead would use the tax increases on businesses to pay for additional state spending and some individual income tax relief.

Legislators need to hear from you, and they are extending an invitation.

The House Taxes Committee wants to hear your thoughts and ideas about Minnesota's tax system by taking this survey <http://www.surveymonkey.com/r/MinnesotaTaxes>. Does the way you are taxed make sense? How could it be improved? What could be done differently to make our tax code simpler, more accountable and more transparent? What ideas do you think the Legislature should consider? Your answers and ideas will help them shape a tax bill.

The Legislature has completed its initial leg marked by the first policy committee deadline of March 15. At this juncture, we draw your attention to a half-dozen noteworthy bills on a variety of fronts.

Taxes:

Biggest boost to business climate: HF 42/HF 174/SF 1066 would either reduce all four individual income tax rates or the corporate tax rate to mitigate tax increases from federal tax conformity updates – sending a signal that Minnesota is serious about encouraging entrepreneurial investment. We support.

Biggest roadblocks to growth: HF 1822/ HF 2125, Governor Walz's tax bill, would increase taxes on the business community by more than \$2 billion over next four years. We oppose.

Workplace mandates:

Biggest workplace mandate: HF 5/SF 1060 would create an expansive, state-administered, 24-week paid leave insurance program on all employers and employees. We oppose.

Better approach to mandates:

SF 2321, the Uniform State Labor Standards Act, pushes back on proposed workplace mandates by prohibiting local governments from enacting any new wage and benefit packages, including scheduling mandates, on private-sector employers. We support.

Transportation:

Best odds of crossing the finish line: HF 50/SF 91, which would require hands-free cell phone use in vehicles, continues to advance with bipartisan support. We support.

Health care:

Best chance to keep premiums in check: HF 629/SF 761, a bill to extend the state's individual market reinsurance program through 2022, passed the Senate floor on a bipartisan vote. It faces an uncertain future in the House despite early expressions of support by House leadership. We support.

All of the Minnesota Chamber priorities remain in play, but work remains. We face challenges in both advancing bills that enhance your ability to grow and in stopping proposals that will hinder your ability to succeed.

Please contact your legislators now, and let them know the real-life impact of these proposals. Your voice makes a difference in our success at the Capitol.
