From the desk of the CEO . . .

Debra K. Boelz



I hope you are settling into your summer routine that also allows for planned AND spontaneous fun! It may take a little extra effort to get from point A to point B with summer road construction, but it will be worth it! For those of us that have worked in the Twin Cities or any other larger metropolitan area, we know what a minor inconvenience the highway 27 road project is and now that the school generated traffic is gone for the summer – piece of cake!

Isn't it fun to see your name in print when it is for something good? Minnesota was ranked 3rd best state in [U.S. News' report of best states in 2019](#). For the past three years Minnesota has consistently been ranked in the top five by U.S. News. The site lists the state's quality education, strong economy and overall quality of life as factors that help keep Minnesota in the top spot.

The phrase "quality education" made me smile! I am a firm believer that learning is a life-long adventure and we should always be reading books to not only gain knowledge but for pleasure. My dream job is being a researcher for Jeopardy!

Little Falls Community Schools recently hosted Dr. James Rickabaugh, Director of the Institute of Personalized Learning. The auditorium was filled with teachers and administrators from various schools in the area plus business owners and community folks like me who have a vested interest in the education our students are receiving as workforce readiness is so important.

Dr. Rickabaugh pointed out how schools are basically teaching with a model developed in the late 1890's that provided an instructor who verbally shared what they knew and students were expected to remember it. We no longer have an economy that relies on those skills.

Fast forward 93 years to the report [A Nation at Risk: The Imperative for Educational Reform](#) that was released in 1983. This report was the result of President Ronald Reagan's National Commission on Excellence in Education and is considered a landmark event in modern American educational history. The report contributed to the ever-growing assertion that American schools were failing, and it touched off a wave of local, state, and federal reform efforts that included increased funding and put pressure on schools to prove academic success. What has changed in the 35 years since this report made headlines? Read on!

Schools are no longer a one-size-fits-all arena of classrooms. Districts are developing curriculum that focuses on developing skill sets and an appetite for learning. Utilizing technology in the classrooms make for unlimited access to everything! Students are not being taught from outdated textbooks in classrooms that restrict the natural inquisitiveness of growing minds.

Careers today need to be fluid as we don't know what new discoveries and technologies lay ahead. In 2017 Manpower, Inc. reported that 50% of the jobs the next generation will have do not exist today. Developing students that have a capacity to learn and are adaptable to change is a must. Accepting that careers have a shelf life is unsettling to some. The question "What do you want to be when you grow up" is no longer valid. However, you can learn something new every day, even in the warm summer days that lie ahead.

2019-2020 Business Plan is being drafted as you read this and will be discussed at the June Board of Directors meeting. Among other things, the Business Plan outlines programming for the membership including educational and networking events. Quarterly Business After Hours were in place when I arrived 15 years ago. To meet the needs of those not able to attend after work, Friday Morning Coffees were added in 2004 at the same time Business After Hours expanded to 10 times per year for a few years, then went back to quarterly with 5 businesses hosting at the Chamber, making a mini expo feel to the events. Due to lack of attendance, Business After Hours evolved into Lunchtime on Location. As everything is cyclical, the next Business Plan will include quarterly Business After Hour events again.
