You wait for it all year; finally, the 46st annual Little Falls Arts & Crafts Fair is this weekend! Sound familiar? That is the opening of all the radio ads that the Chamber runs across the State for the Arts & Crafts Fair.

How many vendors are we expecting for this year's Arts & Crafts Fair? *That is the question I get asked several times a day and am very happy to answer. As you read this, we will be days away from the 46th annual Little Falls Arts & Crafts, the 7th annual Market Place Fair with the 3rd year of the Man Cave. The number of vendors will be about the same as last year – about 600 including the food vendors. There are 88 new artisan vendors as of this printing for this year, making the Fair new and different. Four new food vendors will be joining us. This number is restricted to ensure that our local establishments have great business during the Fairs.*

The Market Place Fair will have 52 vendors and the Man Cave will again include the Department of Natural Resources' "Wall of Shame" – the double wide trailer this year.

Chamber staff spends months working towards a successful weekend for our community. When the vendors start to trickle into town during the week and seeing the power shoppers who arrive by 7:00 am on Saturday morning ready to spend some cash – that makes it all worthwhile!

Please help to welcome not only the vendors, but the thousands of shoppers that will be arriving in our community during this event. I cannot stress enough the important economic impact this weekend has on our local brick and mortar businesses and nonprofit community. Thank you to our Block Hosts that welcome the vendors and assist with questions from the public. Chamber staff cannot be everywhere at once; the Fair covers parts of 10 city blocks on both sides of the river. Add in the satellite parking at the Morrison County Fairgrounds and we need a helicopter to get around!

*Thank you to **Century 21 New Horizons Realty** (Tom, Marvin and Connie) for allowing the Chamber staff to set-up a temporary office in their property at 104 2nd Street SE in the former Bookin' It location. Moving out of the Depot puts the staff closer to the heart of the Fair to respond quickly to issues and answer questions from our shoppers. Being closer to the cheese curds is just a happy coincidence.*

Thank you to the many groups that earn a stipend from the Chamber for assisting with the Fairs. New to the mix is the Little Falls Community High School Boys Soccer team handling garbage for Fairs. The Knights of Columbus start the process of trash patrol by placing the barrel out and picking them up again on Monday morning. The Winter Wonderland Figure Skating Club handles the trash in the food court.

The Spanish Club from Healy High School will be parking cars at the Fairgrounds for us with Living Hope Church staffing the handicapped lots. The Chamber rents part of the Morrison County Fairgrounds for parking, providing funds to the Ag society.

The Boys Soccer will also be providing night security in the Fair Zone. Students and parents from Little Falls Community School Track & Field lend their support in traffic control with the MN State Patrol.

Each vendor licensed through the Chamber to be part of the Fairs pays a \$15 fee to the City of Little Falls. When you see city workers putting up barricades and pylons, moving picnic tables and placing restricted parking sign, those hours are covered by the event.

The Arthur Bernard Johnson VFW Post will provide bulk ice to the food vendors and are provided a stipend to help cover the cost of this important service.

In closing, *it is our job to do this event for the community. A thank you goes out to not only Mary, Fair Registrar and Gina, Volunteer Coordinator, but their families as well for all that they do to make the Fairs a success. Support and assistance from the home front makes it so much easier. I appreciate all of you!*
