



Dr. Kelly L. Griffith currently serves as Superintendent of Talbot County Public Schools. She holds a doctoral degree in Educational Leadership and Innovation from Wilmington University, and a master's degree in Educational Administration from Salisbury University. She has been an educator for thirty-five years of which she has worked thirty years in the Talbot County Public School system. Dr. Griffith began her career in TCPS as a teacher. She then served as an assistant principal, principal of Chapel District Elementary, Easton Elementary, Easton Middle, and Easton High Schools, Director of Student Programs and School Improvement, Assistant Superintendent of Administrative Services, before being appointed as the Interim Superintendent in 2013. She was officially appointed TCPS Superintendent in 2014 after a national search was conducted.

Dr. Griffith is the current president of the Eastern Shore of Maryland Educational Consortium (ESMEC), and has also been involved in a number of educational and professional associations including: Public School Administration Association of Maryland (PSSAM), Maryland Association for Elementary School Principals (President 2005), Team Leader for Middle States Accreditation visits, Maryland Teacher of the Year Judge, Maryland Principal's Advisory Council for MSDE, Maryland Association for Secondary School Administrators, and Executive Board Member of Maryland Negotiations Services. In addition, she has presented at numerous conferences across the state and nationally.

Dr. Griffith remains involved in the community as an Easton Rotarian, and Executive Board Member of the Talbot County Chamber of Commerce, the Talbot Family Network, Talbot Mentors and Junior Achievement. She is also a member of the Local Emergency Preparedness Committee, the Blue Ribbon Commissions for Drugs and Alcohol Awareness, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), and the Maryland Opioid Operational Command Committee. In addition, Dr. Griffith volunteers with Meals on Wheels, the Waterfowl Festival and teaches Junior Achievement.
