Chamber Perspective

2020 started out as a very strong year and many businesses were reporting they were going to have the best 1st quarter in years. Then Covid-19 hit in full force...

The past four months have produced very trying times for many of our members. While we were required to be closed per Governor's orders, we continued to provide services to our members both on an individual basis and in aggregate. We worked with many members to help them navigate the various funding options available while at the same time working to keep all informed about the ever-changing rules of operation. We worked with our Business Resource partners: Dorchester County Economic Development, City of Cambridge Economic Development, Dorchester County Tourism, Cambridge Main Street and SBDC to provide webinars and educational services. We worked to keep our website current with Covid-19 information while working to send enough eblast to keep you informed but not overwhelmed with too many emails.

We are now back in the office and continue to work on your behalf. If there is any support you need do not hesitate to reach out at any time.

Covid has had a significant financial impact on the Chamber. The cancellation of Celebrate Dorchester and the Chamber Challenge Boat Docking events alone represent a 15% reduction in revenues for the year. Combined with slow payments and lost revenue from smaller events means we will need to access the emergency funds the Board wisely set aside each year to allow us to continue to support our members if a financial crisis hit. This is not a long-term solution and we are working to get the Chamber back to solid financial footing again much like you are doing for your business.

We will be feeling the impacts of Covid-19 on our business community for years to come. We want you to know the Board and Staff are here and dedicated to our Vision and Mission and will do all we can to make Dorchester County a strong, sustainable, vibrant community.

We do need your support and want to keep every member and add more members to increase our ability to achieve that vision. If Covid-19 has put your business in a position that makes paying dues impossible at this time, please give us a call to discuss options for payment terms to keep you as an active member. We want to work with and help you and every member.

We are in the process of planning the ramp up to start Chamber events again. Three events that are already on the calendar include:

- A webinar on July 22nd with Jessi Beyer to discuss things to consider as your business emerges from Covid-19.
- We continue the planning for the joint mixer with Salisbury Area Chamber of Commerce for August 20th at Layton's Chance Vineyard and Winery, where there is plenty of space for social distancing while still networking.
- The 30th Annual Chamber Challenge Golf Tournament will be held at the Hyatt on September 11, 2020. Two new things for the event this year. We will be honoring our First Responders and we will be adding a Pickleball Tournament for the non-golfers and to recognize the growth of the sport in the local area. EVERYONE COUNTS Census 2020

Getting folks to respond to the Census every 10 years has always been a challenge, adding a pandemic to the mix has made it even more difficult. The dates have been extended and there is still time to ensure that we count everyone living in the County. The objective of the 2020 Census is to count each person in the location where they were primarily living on April 1 of this year. You have many options to respond; you can mail in the form, you can complete it online or make a simple phone call. There are no good reasons for not completing the census.

Why is the census important? For the next 10 years the government and the private sector will use the data collected during this census to make spending decisions on billions of dollars. Pre Covid-19 it was estimated that each person that was not counted in Dorchester County reduced the amount of our federal funding by \$18,000 – so just undercounting by 100 people would have reduced funding to the County by just short of \$2 million. A good portion of the covid relief funding that came into the County was using the same census data so that number would be significantly higher now. Funds for schools, healthcare, roads, emergency services, services for children and older adults, wildlife preservation and more are all impacted by census counts.

It is not just the government that uses census data to make decisions about where to make investments. Businesses use the data every day to decide where to locate new stores and facilities, where to increase or decrease

staffing, where to approve a franchise, where to build a warehouse/distribution center, etc. Under counting our population puts us at a disadvantage with surrounding Counties and States when it comes to recruiting and growing businesses. Non-profit organizations use census data to help predict what services and service levels they will need to provide. They also use the data as they apply for grant funding to deliver their services to the community.

You say you do not want the government to know where you are, so you are not filling it out. If the government wants to know where you are, they will find you and will not use the census to do it. The Census Bureau is bound by Title 13 of the U.S. Code to keep your information confidential. The Census Bureau cannot release any identifiable information about you, your home, or your business, even to law enforcement agencies. The law ensures that your private data is protected and that your answers cannot be used against you by any government agency or court. All the data collected is shared in an aggregate form and data identifying you is never released.

Completing the census is a very quick process, so if you have not completed the survey please do so today. If you cannot find the paper form that was mailed you can visit <https://my2020census.gov/> on the web or you can call 844-330-2020 to complete the survey. Encourage everyone you know in the County to do the same – we need everyone counted.

If you see Cambridge Mayor Victoria Jackson-Stanley congratulate her on being named a Maryland Census Champion. A *Maryland Census Champion* is a person or group that has gone above and beyond in spreading the Census message in their community.

Neck District Volunteer Fire Company Needs Your Help

UMSR Health’s Cardiovascular Diagnostic Centers earn Echocardiography Reaccreditation by IAC



University of Maryland Shore Regional Health’s Cardiovascular Diagnostic Centers at UM Shore Medical Centers at Chestertown, Dorchester and Easton, at Shore Medical Pavilion at Easton and at Shore Emergency Center at Queenstown, have earned renewed Echocardiography Reaccreditation by the Intersocietal Accreditation Commission (IAC). UM SRH has been accredited through the IAC since 1991.

According to Melissa Svehla, manager, Cardiovascular Services, “This accreditation is constantly monitored and reassessed. We are proud to have been a part of this program for the past 21 years.”

Echocardiography is used to assess different areas of the heart and can detect heart disease or signs of serious conditions. Heart disease is the leading

cause of death in the United States, followed closely by stroke, the fourth highest cause of death.

According to the American Heart Association (AHA), more than 2,150 Americans die each day from cardiovascular disease -- approximately one every 40 seconds.

“This accreditation takes dedication and a lot of work outside of normal hours,” says Dr. Bruce Helmly, Medical Director, Cardiology. “I am proud of the hard work and commitment of this team, and their constant vigilance in maintaining this accreditation.”

Several factors contribute to an accurate diagnosis based on echocardiography: the training and experience of the sonographer performing the procedure, the type of equipment used and the quality assessment metrics each facility is required to measure. IAC accreditation is a “seal of approval” that patients can rely on as an indicator of consistent quality care and a dedication to continuous improvement.

This reaccreditation signifies that all five facilities have undergone an intensive application and review process and were found to be in compliance with published standards, thus demonstrating a commitment to quality patient care in echocardiography.

IAC provides accreditation programs for vascular testing, echocardiography, nuclear/PET, MRI, diagnostic CT, dental CT, carotid stenting, vein treatment and management and cardiac electrophysiology. IAC accreditation programs are dedicated to ensuring quality patient care and promoting health care, and all support the mission of improving health care through accreditation.
