“2018 General Election Propositions and Measures”

Thank you to everyone that completed the September 21 Vallejo Chamber of Commerce survey on certain propositions and measures appearing on the November 2018 general election ballot. The Chamber Board and its President/CEO were interested in hearing from Vallejo Chamber members in advance of the Board determining if it should take a position on any of the ballot measures. The survey of our Chamber members ran for just over two weeks, closing on October 9th.

These survey results help the Chamber better understand the views of our membership to ensure we continue to represent the best interests of our Chamber members. Based on the survey results below, on October 16th the Vallejo Chamber Board voted to publicly endorse Measure S, the Vallejo Unified School District Bond measure. The Chamber Board recognizes how important good schools are to a viable thriving community and believes the funds generated by the bond will be an important necessary step in improving our schools.
