

FAQs: Governor's Executive Order 2020-07

March 17, 2020 – Village of Lombard

This FAQ will be updated as changes arise.

What is Executive Order 2020-07?

Illinois Governor Pritzker issued Executive Order 2020-07 on March 16, 2020 in response to Covid-19. This mandates the closure of all businesses in the State of Illinois that offer food or beverages for on-premises consumption. However, certain provisions apply.

Can I still eat at my favorite restaurants?

You cannot dine-in at any restaurant. Food and beverages must be consumed off-premises.

What can I do?

You can order food from your favorite restaurants! You can pick-up the food yourself or via curbside. The restaurant or a third-party can deliver the food to you. Drive-throughs are also allowed.

If you pick-up food please remember the CDC recommends social distancing of at least six feet (6'). If you are a restaurant owner/manager please ensure your customers and staff are practicing social distancing.

Additionally, you can purchase gift cards to use later.

What restaurants are open for carry out or delivery?

When I pick-up my food can I have a beer or other beverage while I wait?

Sorry, but you can't. The Executive Order mandates no on-site food or beverage consumption.

What about hotels?

Hotels can sell food and beverage via room service, mini-bar, or carry-out.

When does this end?

The Executive Order is in place thru March 30, 2020. Stay tuned for updates.

What else is discussed in the Executive Order?

- Public and private gatherings of more than 50 people are prohibited.
- The one-week waiting period for unemployment insurance claims is waived.
- Provisions were made to the Open Meetings Act.
