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PRESS RELEASE: Fort Atkinson Issues Temporary Hold On All Non-Essential City Government Services to Slow the Spread of COVID-19

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Today, the City of Fort Atkinson made the difficult decision to place all non-essential services on hold and to have all non-essential staff remain at home for the next two weeks. This process began Monday morning and will be fully effective by Monday evening at the close of business. This decision intends to limit the spread of COVID-19, and ensure adequate, healthy staff to maintain City services for the duration of this pandemic.

Public Safety (Fire, Police and EMS) will remain on duty as normal. City Hall will maintain staff during ordinary business hours for absentee voting and voter registration purposes only. Water and Wastewater Utilities have moved to alternate shifts to ensure service is maintained to all customers. On-call teams are in place in all departments to manage emergencies. All other buildings will remain closed to the public.

The City of Fort Atkinson is committed to protecting your health and safety and that of our employees. We are continuing to monitor the spread of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) and are following guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to ensure our community is prepared with the appropriate plan to detect, protect and respond to contact or exposure to this virus.
