Chambers County Officials are continuing to monitor COVID-19 and are working diligently to make decisions that protect citizens but minimize the economic impact of this disease. We understand that many of your businesses are being adversely affected and thus have compiled the list below of resources, information and tips to alleviate economic burdens.

Small Business Administration

The Small Business Administration's Economic Injury Disaster Loan Program provides small businesses with working capital loans of up to \$2 million to help overcome the temporary loss of revenue they are experiencing due to COVID-19. Small Business Administration Paycheck Protection Program

The Paycheck Protection Program is designed to provide a direct incentives for small businesses to keep their workers on payroll by providing each small business a loan up to \$10 million for payroll and certain other expenses. If all employees are kept on payroll for eight weeks, SBA will forgive the portion of the loans used for payroll, rent, mortgage interest or utilities. Up to 100 percent of the loan is forgivable. Texas Workforce Commission

Facebook is offering \$100 Million in cash grants and ad credits for up to 30,000 eligible small businesses.
