### WELCOME BANQUET—MARCH 15, 2010

An additional treat will be participating in a wine tasting event.


To defray some of

### BAKED POTATO SUPPER/COUNTRY NIGHT





## SMITHSONIAN EXHIBIT ENDS MARCH 14

The time is winding down for you to visit the Smithsonian Exhibit “Journey Stories” at the Ellendale Opera House. The committee is hoping you will find some time in the next two weeks to stop in and experience this extraordinary display for the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, DC.

Bring your group, your family or just yourself to browse the panels that depict Journey Stories in the US. Beginning with the stories of the first white settlers coming over on ships from Europe, the tale continues through homesteading to going off to war to taking a family vaca-

tion. Audio, video and artifacts help explain who we are and why we travel.
