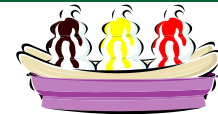


Spaghetti Supper for Flood Victims July 31st at P.U.M.C.

United Blood Services is experiencing a critically low level of blood types O negative, O positive, B negative, and A negative. Donors are asked to make an appointment at their local blood drives or go to www.bloodhero.com.

United Blood Services across North and South Dakota has seen a decrease in donations recently, but patient usage has remained the same. "This is a concerning trend which is why we are requesting any eligible donors with these blood types to roll up their sleeves and help us replenish our blood supply,"

said Leah Finck, donor recruitment representative. "As a community, we must stay prepared for any emergency, surgery, or treatment an area patient may need, so now is the time to volunteer," added Finck.

Volunteer blood donors must be 16 years old or older, weigh at least 110 pounds and be in good health.

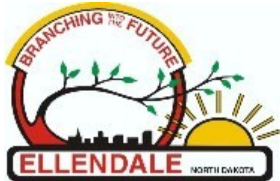
