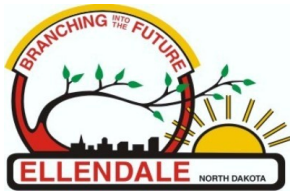

Caring about Each Other's Hearts



As an employee in a local business, would you know how to respond to a customer who suddenly becomes ill in your business? Do you know what signs to look for and what questions you need to ask to intervene appropriately?

On Monday, July 18th, Michele Thorpe, RN, Dickey County Parish Nurse will be hosting an informational learning session for community members on heart emergencies and heart wellness beginning at 6:00 pm at the Fireside. The 2½ hour presentation will include: current heart health standards, recognizing and responding to an emergency, and basics of CPR.

This informational meeting is made available through a ND Area Health Education Center NICE grant. The goal of grant project is to educate community members to intervene early when an emergency is taking place and to educate on modifiable risk factors for heart disease to help save lives and reduce health care costs.
