Corona 2020 Update

Corona employers have been helped by Corona 2020 to create over 1,700 jobs which have saved nearly 240,000 hours in traffic to date since the launch of the plan.

2019 New Laws Taking Effect

Several key measures are taking effect in January 2019 that will effect the Corona economy and local employers including:

Minimum Wage Hike	January 1, the minimum wage in California for employers of 25 or less is \$11 an hour . For employers of more than 25, it is \$12 per hour . We opposed this bill each time it was proposed.
Street Vendors Legalized	Street Vendors are now legal and can be regulated under certain standards locally, including the provision of a business license, health permit, and tax registration.
Dogs, Cats and Rabbits Can no longer be sold in retail locations	Unless obtained from an animal control shelter or similar animal rescue, dogs, cats, and rabbits can no longer be sold in California in retail locations.
Bike Riders Must Wear Helmets	Minors caught without bike helmets will now be issued fix it citations requiring them to attend a safety class.
Motorized Scooter Riders Don't Need Helmets	Adults riding electric scooters, which can legally operate up to 30 mph, are not required to wear helmets (unlike motorcycle or motorized sit down scooters).

ATTACHMENT 2: AB 186 (Cervantes D-Corona)

AB 186 (Cervantes D-Corona) will provide employers up to \$1,000 per qualifying employee apprentice at the rate of \$1 per hour as an incentive for employers to hire and train talented but perhaps not fully qualified potential employees. The proposed tax incentive is capped at 10 employees per tax year.
