**SB 563 (Roth D-Corona)** helps extend and strengthen California's College to Career Access Pilot program by empowering the Chancellor of California's Community College system to name 3 colleges to expand this important pilot program into on a regional basis in partnership with local school districts.

## **ATTACHMENT 4: AB 161 (Ting D-San Francisco)**

**AB 161 (Ting D-San Francisco)** would penalize businesses starting January 1, 2022 up to \$25 each time they offer a printed receipt before a specific customer request. Banks, online apps, and others are providing businesses with a great deal of flexibility in recording transactions with electronic receipts. By 2022, it is very likely paper receipts will be even rarer than today but the legislation, if passed, will be on the books unnecessarily as a regulatory threat to employers.
