## PRESENTATION, DISCUSSION, ACTION

### Corona 2020 Update

Corona employers have been helped by Corona 2020 to create over 1,700 jobs which saved approximately 180,000 hours in traffic to date since the launch of the plan.

We will have a joint discussion with the City of Corona's Economic Development Department on progress of the plan in its first 10 months of implementation and the prospects for manufacturers and employers continuing to create jobs in Corona.

**400 manufacturers in Corona currently, working to help each employer grow the value of their business, especially in the area of automation, market expansion, etc.**

### 2018 Washington DC Summit

We just completed our most successful Washington, DC summit yet with participants having multiple meetings with Senator Feinstein and Harris's staff, Capitol Hill meetings and interactions with Rep. Ken Calvert and Mark Takano, meetings with the leadership of Pepperdine University and Hillsdale College, along with a major conference at the US Chamber of Commerce with policy experts in tax, regulation, and water policy.

In addition, we had an in depth presentation with the United States Navy and were able to discuss our continued partnership with the State of California to protect and expand the operations at Naval Weapons Station Corona.

During the meetings, the staff of Senators Feinstein and Harris were very supportive of the Corona 2020 effort and our efforts as a community to establish a balance between infrastructure development and population growth.

At our meeting on Friday, we will have participants in the Summit share their experiences and we will outline how the Summit's work will help drive the agenda for the upcoming 2019 legislative platform and year.

**Chris Miller by going back to Washington DC we have built great relationships and very effective. Dean Seif noted that the Corona Chamber has one of the largest delegations each year for lobbying in Washington. Kimberly Davidson valued the alliance building, veteran training and business development.**
