Officer Brandi Gills is an officer at the Poquoson Police Department located in Poquoson, Virginia. At this time she is currently assigned to Poquoson Middle School as their School Resource Officer. Officer Gills began her law enforcement career at the Hampton Police Department as a Police Cadet in the year of 2008. In 2010 Officer Gills attended the Police Academy as a Poquoson Auxiliary Police Officer and was hired as a full time Officer by Poquoson shortly thereafter graduating. In 2017 she branched out her career by leaving the police department and becoming a Victim Advocate with the York/Poquoson Commonwealth Attorney's Office. She returned in 2018 to the Poquoson Police Department as a Patrol Officer.

Since her time with Poquoson, Officer Gills has established and installed multiple programs for the Citizens of Poquoson. Officer Gills re-established the RAD (Rape Aggression Defense) program for women and it is offered free of charged to all female citizens. Officer Gills created a program called "My Brave Bag" which provides specialty bags to children who witness or experience traumatic events. Other programs and events she successfully coordinates are the Child Identification Card program, National Night Out, Drug Take Back Day, Police Department Tours, numerous community events, and presents detailed information to civic groups.

Officer Gills was born and raised in Poquoson, she currently still lives in Poquoson with her husband and three dogs. Officer Gills works hard daily to preserve a safe and secure environment by providing fair, friendly, and professional Law Enforcement to her community.
