



David C. Berliner is Regents' Professor Emeritus, Arizona State University. He has taught at the Universities of Arizona and Massachusetts, at Teachers College, Columbia University, and Stanford University, as well as at universities in Australia, Canada, The Netherlands, Spain, and Switzerland. Dr. Berliner is a member of the National Academy of Education, a Fellow of the Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences, and a past president of both the American Educational Research Association (AERA) and the Division of Educational Psychology of the American Psychological Association (APA).

He is the recipient of awards for distinguished contributions from APA, AERA, and the National Education Association (NEA). He co-edited the first *Handbook of Educational Psychology* and the books *Talks to Teachers* and *Perspectives on Instructional time*. He is co-author of *The Manufactured Crisis* (with B. J. Biddle), *Putting Research to Work* (with Ursula Casanova), and six editions of the textbook *Educational Psychology* (with N. L. Gage). His most recent books are *Collateral Damage* (with Sharon Nichols), about the corruption of education through high-stakes testing, and *50 Myths & Lies That Threaten America's Public Schools* (with Gene V. Glass).
