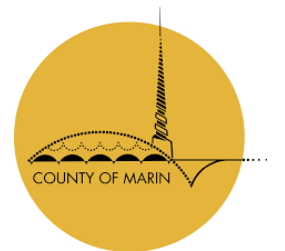

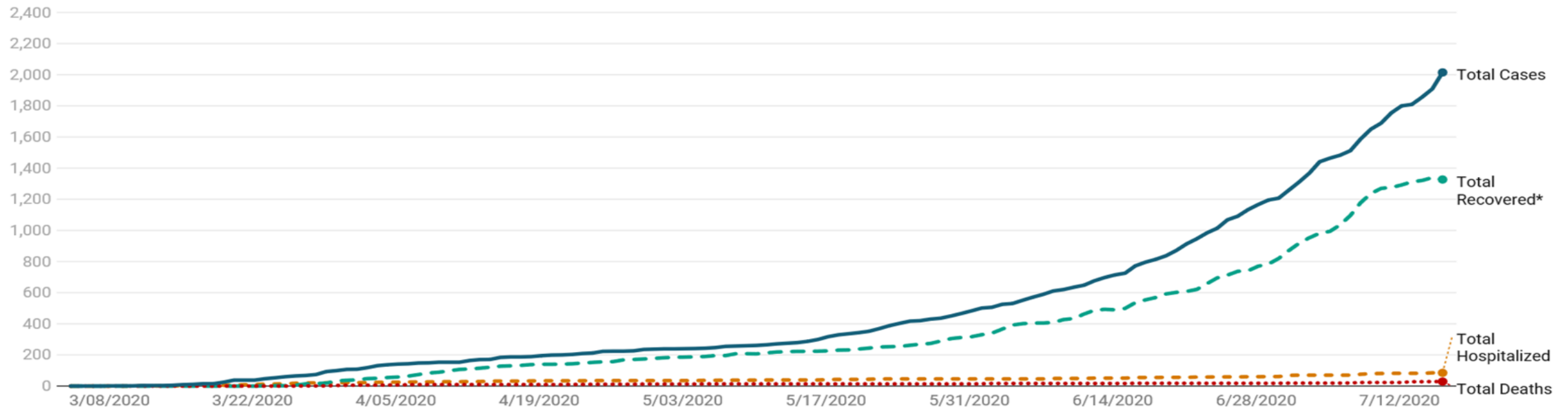

Marin County and COVID

Total Cases, Recovered, Hospitalizations and Deaths by Date Reported among Marin County Community Residents

Tracking the cumulative number of COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, deaths, and modeled estimate of individuals who have recovered helps us understand how this pandemic has impacted our community over time. The figure below displays the total number of cases, hospitalizations, deaths, and modeled estimate of individuals who have recovered among Marin County community residents (does not include data from San Quentin inmates) by date the information was reported to Marin County Public Health. The first case was reported on March 8, 2020. The charts below are live and interactive, hover over the chart with your cursor to see the total number reported each day and observe the daily increase over time.

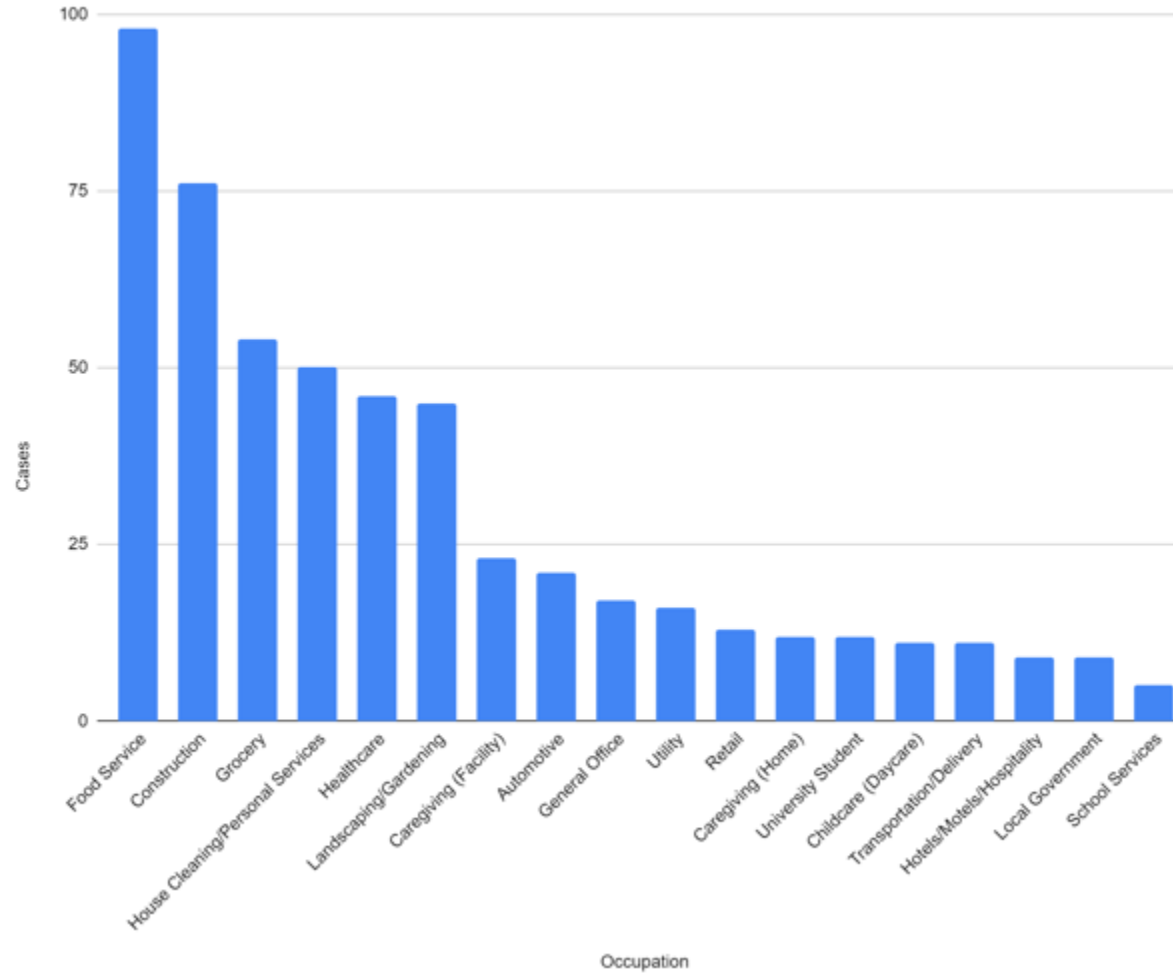


Consequence of Increasing Cases

- Health impact on our community, especially on vulnerable community members
- Some businesses have had to re-close
- Schools are now going to be online until after Labor Day
- Public is encouraged to report public health order violations by businesses, which includes construction
 - the public is encouraged to report violations via email
 - civil penalties
