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No two applicants come to the exam with the same knowledge base. Since education and experience backgrounds are unique to each individual, these differences must be taken into consideration when determining the best method of study. While some individuals may take the exam without any preparation, the majority will need some form of exam preparation.

Since the exams are based on comprehensive performance and experience based knowledge, we are prohibited from teaching specifically to an exam. Applicants are expected to have gained relative experience as part of them seeking certification.

If you are an applicant and have met the applicant requirements, then you should have ascertained the knowledge needed to pass the exam; however, reviewing core concepts and ideas may assist applicants in scoring higher on their exams.

If you come across an area or topic within your preparations for the exam that you are unfamiliar with, it is recommended that you focus your main study efforts on this subject matter. Or, you may want to study a general overview of all potential materials that you could encounter on the exam.
