Compliance Assistance Session on the RRP Rule

What is the RRP Rule?

The Renovation, Repair, and Painting (RRP) Rule requires that firms performing renovation, repair, and painting projects that disturb lead-based paint in homes, child care facilities and pre-schools built before 1978, have their firm certified by EPA, use certified renovators who are trained by EPA-approved training providers, and follow lead-safe work practices.

Why is it Important?

The RRP Rule is designed to protect children and families from hazardous lead dust that could potentially be created when lead-paint is disturbed during renovation, repair, or painting projects.

- Avoid costly fines and civil liability
- Your company will be listed as a Lead-Safe Certified Contractor on the EPA Website, giving your company the potential for new customers.
