Competent Person Fall Protection Certification Course

September 10-11

The Competent Person Fall Protection course is designed for anyone who is working at heights, decision makers and supervisors who are responsible for answering questions about fall protection. This course is designed to give all students the knowledge base to identify hazards both existing and potential and how to mitigate those hazards.

Fall 2018 Lean Construction Program

This is a certificate program that consists of seven units. Following the completion of all seven units, individuals will have a deep knowledge of both the theory and application of Lean Construction and be able to sit for an exam to earn AGC's Certificate of Management - Lean Construction (CM-LC) credential.

OTI - 500 Trainer Course in Occupational Safety and Health Standards for Construction

September 17-20

This course is designed for those interested in teaching the 10- and 30-hour construction safety and health outreach program to their employees and other interested groups. Special emphasis is placed on those topics that are required in the 10- and 30- hour programs as well as on those that are the most hazardous, using OSHA standards as a guide. Course participants are briefed on effective instructional approaches and the effective use of visual aids and handouts. This course allows the student to become a trainer in the Outreach Program and to conduct both a 10- and 30-hour construction safety and health course and to issue cards to participants verifying course completion.

OSHA 10-Hour Training

September 24-25

The OSHA 10-Hour training course is intended as an orientation to OSHA safety training standards and covers safety and health hazards workers may face on construction work sites. Construction workers working on public construction sites in MA are required to have OSHA 10-Hour Training. This training places special emphasis on hazard identification, avoidance, control, and prevention. Workers who successfully complete OSHA 10-Hour training will earn their OSHA Education Center 10-Hour Card.

Building Continuous Improvement - CM-Lean Renewal Course

In the CM-Lean courses we only got to touch on the continuous improvement methods briefly. Continuous improvement is the engine that drives your Lean journey and empowers you to handle any situation you might encounter. To lead change we must embody the change and share those experiences with others. With some discussion, exercises and practice we will look at the challenges in engaging in continuous improvement ourselves to provide perspective in coaching others and building a culture of continuous improvement in our organizations and our industry.

CSL 6 or 12 Hour Classroom Training

October 15 & 22

In order to take this course, an individual must be a holder of a Massachusetts unrestricted Construction Supervisor License and in good standing with the State of Massachusetts and the Board of Building Regulations and Standards (BBRS). Unrestricted License Holders – 12 CEU's required to renew. Licensees may acquire up to a maximum of six hours of continuing education via on-line training. The remaining hours shall be acquired through in-person, classroom training. A Licensee will be required to pass a final exam plus periodic exams through the *on-line course*. Courses taken after January 1, 2018 will be subject to the on-line/in-class requirements.
