

JONATHAN BROH, AIA

Upon completing his education, **Jonathan Broh** moved to Philadelphia in 1996 and began working for then JK Roller Architects in 1997. In 2004 he was named principal, the youngest team member ever to be appointed the title.

Jonathan has worked on a diverse portfolio of projects during his career and has specialized in residential and restaurant work. His completed residential projects show a great diversity from The Icon at 1616 Walnut: an adaptive reuse of a historic office building to Southstar: a contemporary 85-unit apartment on South Street in Philadelphia. Restaurant work includes over 20 Capital Grille restaurants throughout the country and the Pacific Prime restaurant and bar for The Valley Forge Casino. Current projects include



the renovations to The Hale building, an underutilized historic treasure on Chestnut Street; Waverly Court, a 70 unit residential building comprised of a 6 story podium and addition to existing multifamily residence and 3600 Lancaster, a 5-story multifamily new construction adjacent to 13 historic townhomes which will be converted into a 150 unit multifamily building.

In addition to project management, Jonathan directs the human resources and IT decisions for JKRP Architects. He is responsible for recruiting and hiring the talented designers that make the firm successful. Jonathan

manages the 40+ person computer network and has been instrumental in the implementation of BIM and managing the drawing standards for the office.

When he is not in front of his computer in the Wanamaker Building, Jonathan resides in a town home in Center City, which he is seemly always renovating with his wife. An avid
