Stakeholders from public works departments, transfer stations, schools, PTAs, residents and hauling company representatives collaborate on the task force to educate the public and learn relevant best practices in recycling, waste reduction and materials management. Ms. Heaton-Jones is a sought after speaker throughout the region and offers a wide range of educational programs and workshops on such topics as Backyard Composting, RecycleCT's What's IN, What's OUT campaign, Recycle Right and Beyond	Russ Lallier, Allwaste MXI is a leading environmental services firm providing regulated waste management and resource recovery services.
