ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be enrolled in a college or university, and have completed at least one semester.
- Applicant must be enrolled in an accredited program for architecture, engineering, or construction management (AEC) and related disciplines.
- Applicant must be an immediate family member of a member in good standing of the Massachusetts Building Congress (MBC), or an employee of an MBC member or any interns working for an MBC member within the last two years (Oct. 18, 2017–Oct. 18, 2019).

REQUIREMENTS

- Applicant must complete this application form and return it with official college transcript to the MBC by October 18, 2019.
- All finalists will be interviewed by the MBC Scholarship Committee.

AWARDS

- Applications will be reviewed and finalists selected by the MBC Scholarship Committee, which will consider the following: academic record, interest in AEC, AEC or related disciplines experience, extra-curricular activities, and financial need.
- Winners will be notified by November 15, 2019.
- Awards will be made the evening of Wed., December 11, 2019 at the MBC Annual Gala and winners are encouraged to attend.
